2 to 5 April (Easter Holiday)	Shakedown Cruise The opportunity to check how good your work was last winter – includes a pontoon party, a pub meal as well as a walk and cream tea.
23 to 25 April	Shakedown 2 Easter is early this year – so we've got a second opportunity to Shakedown. Just the weekend – but pontoon party and pub meal are on the agenda
26 April onwards	Channel Islands Following directly on from the weekend in Fowey, we can make our way to The Yealm and then Dartmouth or Salcombe and onwards to Guernsey etc
8 / 9 May	Helford Cruise Head over to Helford on Saturday. Evening Barbecue ashore. Sunday is the MYC Sunday Lunch at Budock Vean Hotel.
16 May	Join Pursuit Racers in Carrick Roads An opportunity for those who don't want to race, to join a lunchtime Beach Picnic at the end of the Pursuit Race.
Monday 17 May	BATS Night The annual event where we take members of Blind At Sea (BATS) aboard our boats for an evening around the estuary, followed by food and drinks ashore at St Mawes Sailing Club. Volunteer with your boat to take BATS members for a trip.
22 to 23 May	The lee of The Lizard A weekend either side of the Lizard according to weather. Maybe Porthoustock and Coverack or round the bend, where my chart says " 'ere be Monsters "
29 May	Cruise to Fowey and The Yealm An opportunity for those who don't want to race, to join the Pursuit Racers at the end of the Pursuit Race to Fowey. Pontoon Party followed by a meal ashore at the Royal Fowey Yacht Club. (Numbers limited at RFYC for food – so book early). Then on to The Yealm and/or Plymouth – or return to Mylor on Sunday with the racers.
5 / 6 June	Turnaware and St Mawes Crumpet Join the Social Section Event – The Turnaware Evening Barbecue, spend the night near Turnaware. Sunday morning, set sail to St Mawes for Coffee and Crumpet ashore.
12 to 20 June	Scilly (One) Direct from Mylor to the Isles. The weather and it's stability always govern this entry in the programme – but it is hoped we can make St Agnes, Gugh, Samson, Puffin Island, Bryher, Tresco, Round Island, St Martins and St Mary's in this visit.
Week commencing 4 July	Roundwood Quay Brunch and ANPLF Week The Social Committee's regular and popular event will take place, we hope in the company of our French Twinned Club (ANPLF) who are visiting us having sailed to Newlyn to celebrate the anniversary of General De Gaulle's flight to England in 1940. The week will involve a series of events based around Second World War key points (e.g. Smugglers Cottage and Trebah Gardens).
10 to 12 July	Helford The end of the ANPLF week when we can accompany the Pursuit Racers for a night or two in Helford, with a meal ashore and a walk around Manaccan and St Anthony. Maybe even a Beach Breakfast Barbecue in glorious sunshine.
9 to 25 July	Brittany including Vannes Rally The plan is to get together with those interested in taking part, soon after Easter, to formulate a route and dates. Ideas so far include some of; Moulin Blanc Marina at Brest, Camaret, L'Aber Wach, Rade de Brest, Benodet, Port La Foret, Lorient, Isles de Glenan (as well as Vannes for the Rally on 14 July). 17 to 25 July	Scilly (Two) Another opportunity to visit these glorious islands, weather permitting. Similar itinerary to Scilly One – or elsewhere if the weather is unsuitable
10 to 15 August	National Fireworks Competition Mylor Yacht Club Regatta day is Monday 9 August, following which at 0600 Tuesday 10 we set off to Plymouth for the Final of the National Firework Competition. Wednesday will see a return to Royal Plymouth Corinthian Yacht Club on The Hoe, subject of rave reviews in 2009. Joint events with Moody Owners Association celebrating their 25 th Anniversary will follow.
28 to 30 August	Newlyn Fish Festival & Pursuit Race Follow (or overtake) the racers on the way there and stay around for the Newlyn Fish Festival on the Monday.
11 / 12 September	Final (but Mysterious) Fling We always go to Fowey – but we are not going there and we're not going to Polruan either, neither ... so where will it be? Come along, you'll know then..... and may not be disappointed.
